Indications

FDA-Approved Indications

Colcrys

Gout Flares

Colcrys (colchicine, USP) tablets are indicated for prophylaxis and the treatment of acute gout flares.

- Prophylaxis of Gout Flares: Colcrys is indicated for prophylaxis of gout flares.
- Treatment of Gout Flares: Colcrys tablets are indicated for treatment of acute gout flares when taken at the first sign of a flare.

Familial Mediterranean Fever (FMF)

Colcrys (colchicine, USP) tablets are indicated in adults and children four years or older for treatment of familial Mediterranean fever (FMF).

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Compendial Uses

Behcet's Syndrome 6,8

Pericarditis, Recurrent; Prophylaxis 6,7

Gloperba

Gloperba (colchicine USP) Oral Solution is indicated for prophylaxis of gout flares in adults.

Limitations of use

The safety and effectiveness of Gloperba for acute treatment of gout flares during prophylaxis has not been studied. Gloperba is not an analgesic medication and should not be used to treat pain from other causes.

Mitigare

Mitigare (colchicine) capsules are indicated for prophylaxis of gout flares in adults.

Limitations of use

The safety and effectiveness of Mitigare for acute treatment of gout flares during prophylaxis has not been studied. Mitigare is not an analgesic medication and should not be used to treat pain from other causes.

Initial Limit Quantity

Limits should accumulate across all drugs and strengths up to highest quantity listed depending on the order the claims are processed. Accumulation does not apply if limit is coded for daily dose.

The duration of 25 days is used for a 30-day fill period and 75 days is used for a 90-day fill period to allow time for refill processing.

| Drug | 1 Month Limit | 3 Month Limit |
|----------|-----------------------|------------------------|
| Colcrys | 120 tablets / 25 days | 360 tablets / 75 days |
| Mitigare | 60 capsules / 25 days | 180 capsules / 75 days |
| Gloperba | 300 mL / 25 days | 900 mL / 75 days |
